Self-help helps: A visit to the support groups

You may or may not be aware that our charity offers more than one to one support or day opportunities. The support groups are open to all with brain injury who are able to attend the meetings. A trip to Pershore and Bromsgrove proved to be delightful and enlightening. I was welcomed by all with warmth and interest. "I heard their stories and their struggles, a real eye-opener for those who do not understand brain injuries and the degree to which life can change. I took photos of these strong people who found their group a safe place." They shared tips on how to cope better with some of the ABI symptoms, shared stories from their time in hospital and different experiences from their recovery, all loaded with mixed emotions.

The difference our groups made to a very small portion of those with ABI is invaluable. Peer support is guided by our counsellor and psychologist.

The Bromsgrove group meets first Friday of every month from 12:30 and the Pershore group second Friday of every month, from 13:30.



Paul and Mary have been working hard in the vegetable garden. We may be lucky enough to taste the fruits of their hard work.




BROMSGROVE
